A Change of Theme

At Waterloo, our foundation curriculum is organised under 4 key world issues: Conflict Culture Communication Conservation This week, all the children across school have begun their communication themes.

Why we believe communication is important...

The word 'communicate' comes from the Latin 'communicare', meaning 'to give' or 'to share'. It is the foundation of all human relationships and affects all aspects of our lives. It spreads knowledge and information - authors to their readers, teachers to their students, companies to their customers, friend to friend – across cultures, countries and generations.

We believe that children need to learn how to communicate clearly and positively, using verbal and non-verbal skills to get their ideas and feelings across, to receive other people's messages and to resolve conflict.

Strike Action Information

You may be aware from the recent media coverage, that the National Education Union (one of several teaching unions) declared strike action. This is due to take place on **15th and 16th March 2023**. The strike is taking place due to a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay, and not because of any issues at our school.
