Behaviour Inspection

On Monday, we underwent a behaviour inspection. This audit forms part of a project that we are engaging with and was carried out by the Head of Embrace SCITT and Specialist Leader of Education for The Sea View Trust. Over the course of the day, the inspector visited every classroom, spent time on the playground during break times and visited the dining rooms during lunch. He spent time chatting to the staff and children and observing behaviour across school. I am delighted to report that the outcome was extremely positive. In his follow-up email, the inspector said,

It was an absolute pleasure to visit Waterloo today and meet your team and pupils. You can clearly see the hard work you've put in to challenge and improve behaviour – you should be really proud! Waterloo has a lovely ethos, atmosphere and an obviously supportive culture when it comes to behaviour.

We are extremely proud of this outcome, as shaping the culture of school is a high priority for us. Once again, the children and staff were wonderful. As he left, the inspector said,

"I would send my own children here and I can offer no higher praise than that."
